Weedon Village Association / Weedon Parish Council Coronavirus Risk Assessment – Easter Event – adopted 1 April 2021

## Adopted: 1st April 2021

NB: Government regulation and guidance updated 8 March 2021 introduced a proposed 4-step phased lifting of national lockdown restrictions having effect from 8 March and which are legally enforceable. From 29 March outdoor gatherings of either 6 people (including children) - the Rule of 6 - or 2 households will be allowed. Outdoor playgrounds may remain open throughout but social distancing remains at 2m or, where this is not possible 1m with face covering, or outdoors, or in well ventilated spaces. Face coverings must be worn for all close contact services. Children under 11 are exempted from wearing face coverings. Government guidance on managing playgrounds is updated to 8 March 2021 and has been considered in this risk assessment.
